FROM WASHINGTON.

WASHINGTON, Aug 8.

Advices from Cuba to the 30th of July, received in this city, today, state that the Spanish troops in the Insurrectionary districts have been reinforced by all the disposable forces on the island, preparatory to active operations. In **Cinco Villas** district there has been several contests where small parties were engaged, but in every instance the Spanish were defeated.

It is reported that in these engagements the Spanish loss in killed, wounded and prisoners, amount to nearly 400. These reinforcements are sent principally to the district commanded by General Jordan, the campaign promised to be very active, but on account of the setting in of the rainy season both parties are compelled to suspend operations.

The town of Halquine, is reported to be in possession of the Cubans. with its fortifications and stores, Cespedes' government will be removed to that place as the position is much stronger.

The Cubans continue to be reinforced by volunteers from the United States.

Two hundred and twenty-five recruits from Indiana, Ohio and Kentucky, succeeded in landing on the 23th ult., and joining Gen. Cespede's forces. They carried with them arms and ammunition, and a large supply of camp equipage, and the health of the Cubans is stated to be good.
