NEW YORK, May 4. This morning Gon. Barlow, the new U.S. Marshal, received informatiom from a reliable source that an expedition left this city for Cuba last night. It is said that he telegraphed at once to the Secretary of State to assertain what course he should pursue in the matter. but he had not received an answer up to two o'clock this afternoon. The vessel is reported have left one of the docks on the Jer sey shore, and information communicated about it indicates that it was literally a float-ing resend. The estimated number of men on board the vessel is 800, and each was provided with a rifle and uniform. There was also a large quantity of light clothing taken on board, and provisions were taken sufficient to last during a voyage of one month or six weeks. 'A prother of one of the prominent law yers of this city was taken on board the vessel, as it is claimed, against his will. It is stated, however, by some of the Cunan patriots who remain here to prepare another expedition, that he volunteered to enter the service of the Cuban Army of Liberation. The Marshall is now engaged in investigating the whole matter.
