

The Cuban Revolution.

The Cubans are taking fresh courage since the recognition of their belligerency by Peru and Chili, and the prospect is that they will fit out several expeditions under cover of the Peruvian flag. They have opened a recruiting office at 218 Hudson street, and are engaging men for artillery service, under a promise of \$40 per month in gold, during the time they are in service, and \$500 bounty, as soon as the Cubans obtain their independence. They are negotiating for a quantity of Remington and other breech-loading rifles, and from some source they have raised a handsome amount of capital, on which to put through their schemes. Yesterday they were negotiating for two steamers, one a screw and the other a paddle vessel, which can carry a large number of men, and run at a good speed. The city is full of Spanish spies who are watching the operations of the Cubans, and trying their best to checkmate them.
