HAVANA, Feb. 7.—The insurgents burned eighteen large plantations in the Eastern District. Cholera of a very virulent type is prevalent in the insurrectionary districts; insurgents, Spanish troops and citizens falling victims. Steamer Cabrero lost at sea while carrying Government supplies from Santiago de Cuba to Manzanillo. An attempt of Cubans to fire a powder magazine at Puerto Principe has been frustrated. Two Cuban prisoners, Para and Annois, were killed by troops or volunteers while attempting to escape from Guantnamo. A private letter denies that they were attempting to escape. Jose Cespedes, late commissioner to the insurgents, sailed to-day for America; he says he is disgusted with the state of affairs. Influential and wealthy Cuban families, who generally sympathize with the revolution, continue to emigrate to New York and New Orleans.
