

CUBA.—Captain General Dulce has forbidden the carrying of arms by private persons, and all such arms are to be delivered up to the authorities within four days. The American Consul had telegraphed to Washington to send him aid or accept his resignation. The Captain General told him that he did not recognize his right to ask passports for Americans or any one else. Cubans were taking refuge on the United States steamer Contookook. The American residents at Cienfuegos have applied for a man-of-war. The insurrection has become general in the vicinity of Trinidad, and Havana itself is virtually in a state of siege. Dulce will probably declare it so after the term of amnesty expires.
