

WASHINGTON, June 26.—Cubans here have the following additional particulars regarding the Puerto del Padre battle between Cubans under Marsenal and the Spaniards under Ferré: The Cuban victory is complete, capturing a large train of provisions, arms, clothing and hospital stores, and killing over 200 Spaniards. A number of Americans participated.

The Cubans here also have information that the troops which have been concentrating South of here, numbering 1800, have all departed, and it is believed safely landed.

The representative of the Cubans here had several interviews with the President and several members of the Cabinet, Senators and Representatives. The assurances given them of their earnest sympathy and desire to give practical aid to the Cuban cause, gives great satisfaction. A government agent will be sent to ascertain the strength and prospects of the revolutionists, and if the report is favorable, the Cubans have no doubt of their immediate recognition as belligerents.

HAVANA, June 26.—The marines are now guarding Forts Moro and Cabanas, the volunteers, disavowing any intention to resist De Rodas, having retired.

800 Spaniards were defeated and lost a convoy near Los Tunas. The Spaniards at Cinco

Vulns and Los Tunas were calling for reinforcements. Gen. Puello says five thousand are required in Cinco Villas district.
