

The Cuban Revolution.

The events of the Cuban revolution continue to furnish sanguinary and exciting details to the newspapers. One of the latest contests was that which took place between a column of Spanish troops returning from Manati, and a body of patriot soldiers, under General Vicente Garcia. One hundred prisoners were taken by the Cubans, and General Garcia immediately had them drawn up before him, when he delivered an eloquent and patriotic address, urging the Spaniards to join the patriotic ranks, and fight with his soldiers for liberty, independence, fortune and honor. The result was an addition of a full company of the regular troops to the armies of the patriots. Our other engraving represents the burning of the sugar plantation Los Ingenios, near Trinidad, by the Cuban soldiers.
