FILLIBUSTERS IN CUBA. The following, from the Washington correspondent of the Boston Advertiser, is not the only report of meddlesome interference with Cuhan affairs : Dispatches from Savannah lead the friends of the Cuban revolution here to believe that General J. B. Steedman has made a successful landing in Cuba with a picked force of men. The expedition has been in preparation for a number of months. The belief is that near one thousand men, well supplied with arms and thoroughly accustomed to their use, have made a landing on the Cuban shore. The revolutionary leaders have been fully acquainted with General Steedman's movement for some time. It may be stated in this connection that the navy department has just added five vessels to the South Atlantic squadron, so that it now consists of eleven vessels, with an aggregate of one hundred and eight guns.
