Recommination of the Decree Establishing Religious Liberty-A Protestant Church to be Opened in Mayana-Tranguillity.

MAVANA, Oct. 25.-The decree of the Constitutional Cortes, establishing unrestricted liberty of religion in the colonies of Cuba and Porto Rico, was to-day promulgated in this taland, and has gone into effect as the law of the land. The document is exceedingly liberal in its torms. It declares that Spain cannot remain removed from the general movoment of Europe and the world, and adds that this consideration is the more powerful for the Antilles, because they lie near a continent where liberty of religion is recognized by law. One clauss of the decree provides that no person shall be prevented from holding office under the Government by reason of his religious bellef. The decree is received with general satisfaction by the populace. As there is now no obstacle, it is probable that a Protostant Church will soon be established in this city.

Captain-General DE RODAE is reducing the novation of officials in the Government employ, and has by this means already effected a considora ble saving for the public treasury.
