The Ensurrection—Railroad Operations of the Rebels—Discharge of the Privateersmen at Wilmington, N. C.

HAVANA, Oct. 30.—Intelligence from the Central Department is to the effect that a body of insurgents, while operating on the Cienfuego and Villa Clara Railroad, obstructed the track in such a manner as to cause a freight train to be run off. They then carried away the freight into the interior, and burned a bridge, thus cutting off communication between the two cities.

The United States flagship Powhattan, Admiral Poor commanding, arrived at this port to-day.

WILMINGTON, N. C., Oct. 30.—All of the officers of the privateer Cuba were to-day discharged by the Commissioner. except David A. Telfair, D. D. Munroe, Nicholas Isling, R. H. Gibson, N. D.
