The Adventurers of the *Lillian*—Action of the United States Naval Authorities.

Special Dispatch to the New-York Times.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—The State Department has received information that the 300 Americans, who were induced to ship on board the steamer *Lillian*, for Cuba, have been landed near Nassau, N. P., and the *Lillian* has been captured and held at Nassau on charges of having violated the Neutrality laws. The persons are in a destitute condition, and have applied to the American Consul for relief, but he feels that he has no authority of law to supply their wants. Of these men 100 have been sent to Key West, and the Navy Department will dispatch another vessel for the remaining 200, providing they agree not to violate the Neutrality laws again.

Resignation of Consul-General Plumb Accepted.

HAVANA, Nov. 22.—United States Consul-General PLUMB was to-day notified by the State Department that his resignation had been accepted, to take effect on the 1st of December. Consul HALL, at Matanzas, has been ordered to take charge of the Consulate at this place. The Department, in accepting Mr. PLUMB's resignation, awards him the highest praise for the course he has pursued while administering the duties devolved upon him.
