Rumored Disappearance of a Cuban Steamer. , From the Newbury Journal, Dec. 15.

Yesterday afternoon one of the officers of the Anna, which was recently sold, as was susnected, to the Cubabs, was looking around anxi-

ously for a fireman, as he said they wanted to test the new boiler which had been put in by CAULDWELL. The supposition is that the officer found a man, for the Anna cleared out from here and has not been seen since. It is thought that she started at about 8 o'clock, giving her ample time to steam down to New-York and out into the ocean before daylight this morning if it was the design to get her out to sea. She had a full crew on board-just how many men in all is not precisely known here. It is believed, however, that she carried nothing in the way of a cargo. Her officers settled all bills-amounting to about \$6,000-before she started, paying up the last dollar of indebtedness for repairs, new boiler, machinery, &c. She was officered by Cubans, and by some here is supposed to have sailed for that island by way of Florida.
