A Spanish Frigate with Troops—Prisoners Sent to Spain—South Carolina Votes for Recognition.

HAVANA, Dec. 1.—A Spanish frigate arrived here to-day from Spain, bringing a battalion of troops for service in the island. H. C. HALL, the newly-appointed American Consul-General in Havana, to-day took possession of the United States Consulate. The merchants of Havana are desirous that the appointment of Mr. HALL be permanent. A detachment of prisoners were yesterday sent to Spain. Among them were Colonel UDAETA, who surrendered at Bayamo, and ADOLFO MOLINER, a wealthy planter.

COLUMBIA, S. C., Dec. 1.—Both Houses of the Legislature to-day adopted resolutions expressive of sympathy for Cuba, requesting the recognition of the insurgents as belligerents by the United States, and pledging the last dollar and man to the Government in case of war.
