HAVANA, Dec. 23.—A large fire occurred last night on Prado-street, which is generally supposed to be the work of an incendiary. An

Many houses, generally belonging to prominent Cubans, were searched last night by the Police. Forty well-known citizens have received peremptory orders to leave for Spain in the Cadiz steamer which sails to-morrow. Among the banished are RICARDO and ENRIQUE RE-PARTE, SERAFIN PACHECO, SILVERIO JORRIN, EMILIO CESPEDES, CARLOS FONT and FRANCESCO These orders will probably be followed up by the transportation of all suspected or gullty parties of prominence. supposed that these measures will put a finishing blow to the insurrection.
