Arrival of the Officers and Rean of the Cuban Privateer Lilliam in Mavaanah.

Conroy, Frank Bonnett, Duncan Rankin, Charles Miller, S. F. Kelly, of New-York ; Jerry Lyons, Teranco Dolan, Patrick McGuire, of Galveston; James Morrison. of Atlanta.

The Severn arrived at Tybee on Sunday morning last, from Key West, with her living freight. These men were captured by the British authorities with the Lillian, but were released. They were brought from Nassau, N. P., by the United States steamer *Powhatan*, to Key West, and transferred to the Severn.
