

Arrival of the Officers and Men of the Cuban Privateer *Lillian* in Savannah.

Considerable sensation was created in town on Sunday afternoon last by the arrival of the tug *Christiana*, from the United States ship *Severn*, bearing the flag of Rear-Admiral Poor, of the North Atlantic Squadron, with the following-named officers and men lately belonging to the Cuban privateer *Lillian*: Captain John E. Polard of New-York; Captain Simeon Grant, of Philadelphia; Captain Charles Keans, First Lieutenant Eugene Courtney, First Lieutenant John T. Dixon, Second Lieutenant John Williamson, of Galveston, Texas; Edward Buckley, Hugh McGaury, A. Peneiro, M. Alvers, F. Conta, M. Lopez, F. Garon, F. Gaychen, M. J. Conroy, Frank Bonnett, Duncan Rankin, Charles Miller, S. F. Kelly, of New-York; Jerry Lyons, Terance Dolan, Patrick McGuire, of Galveston; James Morrison, of Atlanta.

The *Severn* arrived at Tybee on Sunday morning last, from Key West, with her living freight. These men were captured by the British authorities with the *Lillian*, but were released. They were brought from Nassau, N. P., by the United States steamer *Powhatan*, to Key West, and transferred to the *Severn*.

They found hosts of friends in this city, the sympathizers with the cause in which they were (and we hope will again be) engaged manifesting an amount of good will that was warmly appreciated by the unfortunate men, who are stopping at Mr. BRESSON's hotel, where they are treated with a liberality characteristic of the proprietor.
