NEW YORK, 29.

The U. S. Steamer Pawnee arrived at the Brooklyn navy yard yesterday. She has been cruising in the Atlantic, along the American coast, during the last two years and a half, and will now be put out of commission, and immediately placed in repair. The officers will be detached and on shore duty, and the crew will be discharged.

Arrived, Steamships City of Dublin and Hammonia.

Marshal Barlow emphatically denies that any expedition has left this City, at any time, for the invasion of Cuba, except the Steamer Peril. He says that the vessel only carried about 200 men, who were intended to take charge of the ordnance which it had on board, until it reached the hands of the Cuban insurgents.

General Goicouria, whom report had in command of the Cuban expedition which many claim left this harbor on Saturday night, was arrested yesterday by U. S. Marshal Barlow, on board the Catharine Whiting, and lodged in Ludlow street jail. The charges against him, as contained in the warrant, are for having, on or about the 25th day of June, knowingly and wilfully set on foot and prepared the means for a military expedition and enterprise, to be carried on the United States, against the territory and dominion of the foreign state of Spain.

The officers last night were quite confident of capturing Col. Ryan again before morning, but up to a late hour this morning they had not been successful.
