World's Havana correspondent gives particulars, probably suppressed by telegraph, of many cruel deeds perpetrated by the Spanish authorities, in Cuba. Sixty-three of the most respectable citizens of Havana have been torn from their home and sent to Spain on suspicion, and seventeen more have been thrown into jail to be tried for their lives. A kingsman of the Georgia Lamo and a young millionaire planter, has been barbarously executed at the demand of the Malanzas volunteers. Other citizens have been shot by order of a court martial, and two aged and infirm men who could not be well shipped away have been put under bonds of ten thousand dollars each to keep the peace towards Spain.
