War Statistics from Cuba—The Carlist Agitation.

MADRID, Dec. 5, 1869.

In the Cortes yesterday General Prim stated that since the commencement of the Cuban rebellion fourteen vessels of war, including two iron-clads, had sailed for Cuba, transporting nearly 40,000 troops.

The Carlist Chief Polo has been convicted of treason and sentenced to death.

Rumors of a Carlist insurrection continue to circulate.
