

## **Arrest of an Alleged Cuban Recruiting Officer at Richmond, Va.**

WASHINGTON, June 18, 1869.

From Richmond I have received the following to night:—

United States Marshal Parker this morning served a warrant, issued by Commissioner Chaboon, against a young gentleman, who was charged therein with being a recruiting officer of the Cuban patriot army and attempting to organize a company here, in violation of the neutrality laws. On being carried before the Commissioner the arrested party gave his name as H. H. Harrison, of Winchester, Va., recently returned from Europe. He did not make any disclosures in connection with the object imputed to him. Of proof positive there was little or none. Harrison was bailed in the sum of \$1,000 for his appearance before the Commissioner to-morrow morning.

It is reported that a number of parties from this city have joined the organization said to be represented by Harrison. I learn from an authentic source that General Jack Gleeson, formerly of the Fenian army, is about to visit Cuba, with a view to ascertain the actual condition and resources of the patriots before the Fenians will afford them any material assistance.
