CUBA. Estimates of Expenses—Civil Law Re-established in Several Jurisdictions—Cable Despatches to Be Sent in the Fature Whether Favorable to the Spanjands or No.

HAVANA, July 9, 1869.
The government estimates the expenditures for July at \$2,000,000, distributed as follows:—War, \$500,000; Navy, \$200,000; Interior, \$750,000; Edu-

cation, \$11,000; Miscellaneous, \$550,000. The government has embargoed up to date 540 estates, of which twenty have produced \$75,000 for the State. The rest are in a state of liquidation. Count Yalmased awrites to the Captain General that the civil authority has been re-established in
