ALL Spaniards in the Military District of Trinidad Compelled to do Duty.

HAVANA, July 27, 1862.

The Governor of the jurisdiction of Trinidad has issued rigorous orders obliging all Spaniards between the ages of fifteen and sixty to do duty in the field or reserve corps, while persons unfit for active service are to garrison the towns. The press praise the measure and demand that it be made general in its application throughout the island.
