**Cuban Deputies to Be Summoned to the National Legislature—Naval Reinforcements for Cuba.**

LONDON, Sept. 17, 1869.

The *Official Gazette* of Madrid will shortly publish, by order of the government, a decree summoning the Cuban deputies who may have been chosen according to the terms of the new constitution lately legislated in the Spanish capital to appear and take their seats in the National Cortes.

Five war frigates, with other vessels of the navy, are about to be despatched to Cuba. They will, it is said, sail at an early day.
