HAVANA, April 14.—Volunteers are organizing in the interior. The *Voz de Cuba* warns the public against over confidence in the termination of the insurrection.

The *Diario* says that Spanish war steamers are watching two expeditions which are expected from the United States.

A decree authorizes the raising of a thousand additional guardians to protect the plantations of western planters, who are to pay them.
