
THE WEST INDIES.

Arrival of Troops at Havana—A Skirmish in Cuba—Revolt of Blacks in Martinique.

HAVANA, Oct. 15.—A steamer has arrived here from Spain with 3,000 troops on board. Gen. VALMASEDA reports an action at Moto Nuevo, in which 100 insurgents were killed. The Spanish loss is not stated.

The blacks in Martinique revolted on the 24th. ult., and burned fifty plantations and killed some whites. The revolt was suppressed. It was caused by the revolution in France.

Courts-Martial in Cuba—A Hurricane Apprehended.

HAVANA, Oct. 15.—PIMENTAL, on his way from San Salvador, has been captured and taken to Cienfuegos, to be court-martialed. The crew of the schooner captured at Cayo Cruz have been court-martialed, and three of them shot, and two imprisoned for life.

HAVANA, Oct. 16.—Bad weather is threatening. The barometer is low and has been sinking since morning. The approach of a hurricane is apprehended. The vessels in port have all their anchors down and are making snug.
