
The Last of the Cuban Junta—The Law Respected.

A meeting of the Cuban Junta took place last evening, at Masonic Hall, Thirteenth-street, J. M. CESPEDES presiding. There were present Señors MESTRE, BEMUDEZ, BEINEIDRO, and others interested in the success of the Cuban insurrection. This society, which has worked so indefatigably for the cause of Cuba, was brought to an end, before accomplishing the object for which it was instituted, by the following resolution, proposed by Señor MESTRE:

Resolved, That in view of the late neutrality proclamation of the President of the United States, and its relation to Cuba, this society, called the Cuban Junta, be dissolved.

A short discussion followed, but the resolution was unanimously adopted, and the last meeting of the Cuban Junta adjourned.
