The Insurgents' Account of the Winter Campaign — A Disastrous Spanish Failure—The Unarmed Cubans Clamorous to Attack.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Feb. 25.—Colonel VARONA transmits the following information to the Cuban Junta in New-York: The Spanish Winter campaign came to a disastrous end at Najasa, Cuba, on the 28th of January. The Spanish retreated to the towns. Delegations from the unarmed classes of the Cuban Army are begging for arms to attack the towns. CESPEDES has appointed General QUESADA and Colonel ADOLF VARONA to an important foreign mission. They sailed from Cuba in the midst of the enemy's cruisers. They arrived at Nassau, and are now at Jacksonville, and will be in New-York some time between the 26th inst. and the 1st of March.

HAVANA, Feb. 26.—Telegraphic communication has been established between Havana and Ciego de Avila. In the Cinco Villas district operations against insurgent bands are exceedingly active.
