The Cuban Question in Spain—The Cession of the Island Urged and Opposed— Ocean Mail Service-The Bonaparte Trial.

MADRID, March 17.—The controversy among the newspapers relative to the cession of the island of Cuba to the United States still continues. Some argue that now the insurrection there is nearly quelled, and the dignity of Spain properly asserted, it would the better to cede Cuba and thus avoid internal troubles hereafter. Their opponents advise these not to erave for gold but for Spanish interests; and others still are opposed to all agitation of the question at present.

PARIS, March 17.-American newspapers were distributed here today for the first time in twelve days. There is great dissatisfaction with the trans-oceanic mail facilities..... The specie in the Bank of France increased 19,900,000 francs since last has Thursday ... HENRI ROCHEFORT has been taken to Tours, where he is to appear as a witness in the Bonaparte-Noir homicide case. Louis Noir announces in the public prints today that he has now been admitted as a partie circle against Prince BONAPARTE.

LONDON, March 17.—It is said that the Emperor NAPOLBON has consented to arbitrate in the *Tornado* case....Mr. SOUTHEBLY, a book auctioneer of this city, sold a copy of SHAKES-PEARE'S works, first folio edition, for £360 ster-Hug ... The amount of specie in the Bank of England has disreased £77,000 since the last report.
