A meeting of this Committee was held last evening in the Commonwealth Hall. The meeting was called to order about 8 o'clock by the President, Geo. C. Bennett. After some formal business a discussion ensued relative to the late attempt at reorganization of the Republican forces in the Twelfth Ward. The report of the election and reënrolment effected there was remitted to the Executive Committee for the purpose of instituting a more thorough and satisfactory registration, and of generally endeavoring to repair the existing disunion of that district.

3. That a copy of the foregoing be presented to our Senators and Representatives in Congress, and that they be respectfully requested to urge the adoption of measures extending beligerent rights to the Cubans.
