Volunteers in the Spanish Service— Cubans Still Surrendering.

HAVANA, March 3.—The officers of the Volunteer Legion called on Captain-General DE RODAS to-day and formally offered their services in behalf of the Spanish cause. They have fully organized the Legion, and are ready to take the field. Admiral MALCAMPO has sailed with five gunboats to watch the expeditions which were reported to have left New-York last Saturday. Two hundred and twenty-eight insurgents, commanded by JOSE MARTINE, some armed with rifles and others with machetes, came in from the Puerto Principe region yesterday, and voluntarily surrendered to the Government authorities near Villa Clara. One hundred and forty more presented themselves at Las Minas and Ricas, and asked to be allowed to take the oath of allegiance to Spain.
