The Outrage on Mr. Phillips—An Inquiry by a Man-of-War—The Revolt—A Pious Trick Exploded.

HAVANA, April 19.—The United States flag-ship Serern has gone to Santiago de Cuba to inquire into the outrage committed on Mr. PHIL-LIPS, the American Consulat that port. The United States iron-clad Dictator is expected to call at Havana before proceeding north. Two Cubans, who arrived here today from New-Orleans, were arrested on landing. The Havana journals report, on the authority of the Secretary of the Captain-General, that the insurgents no longer recognize CESPEDES as the head of their Government, and have offered the Presidency to FORTUNO. Five prominent Cubans of Puerto Principe, have issued a long manifesto to the insurgents in the field advising them to lay down their arms. At Maugua, a village twenty miles from Havana, great excitement was caused by the report that the Virgin Mary had appeared to two girls there during Holy Week. The report spread, and large numbers of the pious and curious flocked to the house in which the girls lived. The attention of the police was called to the affair, and the Governor of the district, suspecting some political design in the assembling of so many people, went to the place, denounced the vision as an imposture, and compelled the people to disperse.
