#### THE WEST INDIA ISLANDS.

**Loss of a New Spanish Steamer on the Cuban Coast—Another Victory Over the Insurgents—Quiet in Hayti—The West Indian Telegraph in Porto Rico—Revolution in San Domingo—Affairs in Jamaica.**

HAVANA, May 22.—The publication of the *Prensa* is discontinued, that journal having been merged into the *Voz de Cuba*. Señor GELPIU, editor of the *Prensa*, becomes managing editor of the *Voz de Cuba*....The Spanish steamer *Sancti Spiritus*, while on her first trip after receiving new boilers, was lost on Cayo Piedras. All the officers and crew were saved.

The Captain-General telegraphs that the combined operations of the columns of CHINCHILLA, FIJARDO, and MONTANI have produced excellent results. Seventy-six rebels, including eight chiefs and two citizens of the United States, have been killed, and twenty-two taken prisoners. The rebel Col. BEMBETA's equipage and correspondence have been captured. Col. CHINCHILLA, who is a nephew of Regent SERRANO, was severely wounded. Col. BERGEL reports that his detachment has killed twenty-five insurgents.

#### HAYTI.

HAVANA, May 22.—Advices from Hayti represent that the country continues peaceful. Opposition to the established Government was practically ended. The troops had captured or dispersed the last bands of Piquets, many of whom had been executed. Large quantities of counterfeit Haytian currency had been discovered.

#### PORTO RICO.

HAVANA, May 22.—Gen. SANZ, Governor of Porto Rico, has been recalled, and returns to Spain by the next steamer. The work of constructing the land lines of the West India telegraph in the island was going on without interruption. Sir CHARLES BRIGHT visited St. Thomas on the 16th inst. to make arrangements for landing the telegraph cable. The Porto Rico sugar market was dull.

#### SAN DOMINGO.

SAN DOMINGO, May 9, via HAVANA, May 22.—Reports from the interior announce that CABRAL gains adherents and the revolution increases, the people believing that annexation to the United States is a hoax. The ratification of the treaty is loudly called for here as the only means of restoring tranquility. Judge O'SULLIVAN has arrived here from New-York on business connected with the project of annexation.

#### JAMAICA.

KINGSTON, May 10, via HAVANA, May 22.—The ship *Milicete* arrived here on the 29th ult., with a section of the West India and Panama telegraph cable, and on the 3d inst. the United States steamer *Yantic* brought Sir CHARLES BRIGHT, the director of the enterprise. The steamers *Suffolk*, *Dacia*, *Tilian* and *Beuledi*, with the remainder of the cable, are daily expected here. Several English telegraph operators came by the *Milicete*. It is anticipated that the cables will be laid by the end of June. Hayti has applied to be brought into telegraphic communication.

#### MARTINIQUE.

HAVANA, May 22.—News has been received from Martinique that Gen. FALCON, Ex-President of Venezuela, had arrived there from Europe on his return to his native country, but died of apoplexy three days after he landed.
