ARRIVAL OF THE STEAM-SHIP MORRO CASTLE.

The steam-ship Morro Castle, which left Havana on May 21, reached this port yesterday. Purser R. W. ALBERT has our thanks for courtesies. Our Havana letter, the publication of which is deferred for lack of space, contains a letter from the Colonial Minister at Madrid, in which that dignitary counsels prudence and moderation to the loyal inhabitants of Cuba, and especially to the volunteers. It also embodies a rumor to the effect that the Intendente advocates the placing of a loan of \$50,in the United States, if pos-000.000sible, giving the island and its revenues as security. This, however, adds our correspondent, is merely a rumor. If true, it would give the Spaniards plenty of money, and form a party of bondholders for them in the United States. VALMASEDA had written to: the Diario de la Maring, requesting that journal to deny the current report that he and Rodas were on bad terms. No war news of importance was at hand.
