A Havana dispatch announces on official authority that the expedition from this City on the *George B. Upton*, which had landed at Punta Brava, a few miles east of Nuevitas, was immediately attacked by Spaniards and gun-boats, and dispersed. Ten of the filibusters were killed, including Capt. HARRISON; two were drowned, and three were made prisoners. The steam launch, rubber rafts, and the cargo of war material, including medicine, was captured, the landing having been successfully effected. The *Upton*, after the landing, sailed for Colombia, to bring 100 Colombians to join the Cubans. The *Voz de Cuba* says the prisoners were immediately executed. The date of the landing is not given.
