CUBA.

A Havana dispatch announces on official authority that the expedition from this City on the George B. Upton, which had landed at Punta Brava, a few miles east of Nuevitas, was immediately attacked by Spaniards and gun-boats. and dispersed. Ten of the filibusters were killed, including Capt. HARRISON: two were drowned, and three were made prisoners. The steam launch, rubber rafts, and the cargo of war material, including medicine, was captured, the landing having been successfully effected. The Upton, after the landing, sailed for Colombia, to bring 100 Colombians to join the Cubans. The 'Voz de Cuba says the prisoners were immediately executed. The date of the landing is not given.
