

The Cuban Bond Robbery—An Arrest.

It will be remembered that on the 25th of June last the room at the St. George Hotel, corner of Broadway and Twentieth-street, of CARLOS CASTELLO, Treasurer of the Foreign Special Cuban Mission, was entered about 10 o'clock in the morning, and robbed of \$85,000 in United States registered bonds, beside a number of Cuban bonds and a quantity of money. Since that time Superintendent JORDAN and Capt. KEISO have been in search of the property as a means of reaching the thieves, but until yesterday all efforts were totally unsuccessful. The case was in the hands of Detective EUSTACE, who yesterday arrested on Broadway one JOSEPH GREGORY, a cigar-dealer, twenty-seven years of age, who had in his possession \$10,000 of the stolen bonds. The prisoner was taken to the Central Police Office, where he was locked up to await arraignment before Justice SHANDLEY, at the Jefferson Market Police Court. As yet the prisoner has had no opportunity to explain his possession of the stolen bonds, but as he is not known to any of the officials as a "crossman," it is not probable nor is it claimed that he is the thief. Col. Wherry, Chief of the United States Secret Service, assisted in making the arrest, and has aided materially in working up the case to the point it has now reached.
