The Panama and Havana Cable—Celebration of its Completion to Santiago.

SANTIAGO DE CUBA, Aug. 28.—There have been great rejoicings over the laying of the cable to Santiago. There was a grand illumination of the harbor last night, a display of fireworks, and a torchlight procession in boats. Sir CHARLES BRIGHT was serenaded by 400 volunteers, who chartered some river steamers, and, illuminating them, sailed around the vessels of the expedition, their bands playing "God Save the Queen." The steamers *Dacia*, *Suffolk* and *Vestal* were also illuminated. Count VALMASEDA and over 500 of the first citizens visited the *Dacia* and inspected the machinery for laying the cable. The celebration commenced last night at 8 o'clock and continues this morning. The citizens have been invited to a ball on the *Vestal*. The cable is working finely. The enthusiasm on shore is unbounded. The expedition will probably remain here five days.
