## GENERAL EUROPEAN NEWS.

**Gen. De Rodas and Emancipation in Cuba—Indemnity for American Losses—The Vomito Spreading in Spain—Vote of Confidence in the Austrian Reichsrath—Revision of the Bible.**

LONDON, Sept. 26.—The Madrid correspondent of the NEW-YORK TIMES, states that Señor CABELLERO DE RODAS refuses to execute the orders of the Spanish Minister for the Colonies, and the laws created by the Cortes, relative to the gradual abolition of slavery in Cuba.

The Spanish Government will accede to the proposition to name a commission to fix the indemnities payable for American losses in Cuba.

MADRID, Sept. 28.—The vomito is spreading rapidly at Barcelona. Many people are leaving, and business is at a standstill.

The *Discussion* continues to denounce the practical nullification of the Emancipation law by Cuba. The writer quotes from the Havana journals, advertisements of "children for sale, separate from mothers," to prove his assertions. In concluding, he calls the attention of the Government to the contracts which are publicly made in the colonies for slave labor, which, he affirms, is practically a continuation of the system of slavery, in violation of the express law of the land.
