CUBAN AFFAIRS.

The Emancipation Law to be Executed —Publication of the Decree—Arrest of a New-York Editor.

HAVANA, Sept. 29.—ALFRED J. CLARK has been recognized as the American Consular Agentat Remedios Regent SERANNO has ordered the execution of the Spanish Emancipation law in Cuba and Porto Rico. All children of slave mothers born henceforth are free; all those born since 1868 are free upon certain conditions; all slaves over sixty years of age at this date are free, and all others as soon as they arrive at sixty years of age; all slaves belonging to the State are declared all who have rendered public and services during the insurrection. soon as Cuban Deputies lare admitted to the Spanish Cortes, the Government will present a project of law for the complete emancipation of the slaves. Captain-General DE Rodas has ordered to be published the law....FERRER DE CONTO, the editor of the Cronista, published in New-York, has been arrested.

Washington, Sept. 29.—The Secretary of State received the following telegram from Acting Consul-General Hall, dated Havana, Sept. 28: "Emancipation decree published yesterday. The provisions are similar to the plan of law published at Madrid May 28.
