Good News from Cuba—Compliment to Royalty.

MADRID, JAN. 16, 1870.

There is great rejoicing here over telegrams from Havana reporting important successes of the troops in Cuba.

The Duke of Montpensier has been nominated as a candidate for the Cortes from the city of Oviedo.

CUBA.

Reported Surrender of Insurgents—Spanish Opposition to Reforms—Protests Against Proposed Reforms in Porto Rico—Marine Disaster.

HAVANA, JAN. 15, 1870.

The *Gaceta* to-day publishes despatches from the interior announcing the surrender of insurgents in large numbers.

The Spanish troops in the Central Department are on the march to attack the insurgents.

The Spanish mail steamer which sailed to-day took a memorial signed by thousands of Spaniards requesting the Cortes to defer the granting of liberties and reforms in Porto Rico. The document gives as a reason for this request that the granting of these privileges will prove highly injurious to the cause of Spain in Cuba, be used as a weapon against the Spaniards and weaken the power of the government. The residents of Cuba at present do not desire such reforms. The country is unprepared to receive them, and the people prefer to wait until Cuba is represented in the Cortes.

A car loaded with petroleum was burned at the railroad station this evening. The fire, it is thought, was caused by an incendiary.

The schooner *Lookout*, from Norfolk for Barbados, with a cargo of lumber, was lost on the 7th inst. Her crew were brought to this port to-day by the *Alicia*.
