**One of the New Spanish Gunboats Wrecked—
The American Tug Lloyd Aspinwall Seized
by Mistake—Arrival of Another Instalment
of the Mesquite Fleet.**

HAVANA, JAN. 30, 1870.

The new Spanish gunboat No. 3 ran ashore on the Colorado Reefs and is a complete loss. Her crew have arrived at this port.

The steamer lately captured off Nuevitas by a Spanish man-of-war, was brought to this city to-day. It turns out that she is the American tug Lloyd Aspinwall, now in the Haytian service, and was carrying despatches to the Consul General of the United States at Havana and the admiral commanding the United States navy in West India waters. An investigation is in progress, and the tug will probably be released to-morrow.

The second lot of Spanish gunboats built at New York have arrived at this island. Twelve of them entered this harbor this morning, and the thirteenth has arrived at Cardenas. They experienced a very heavy storm on the Florida coast.
