Attempted Departure of a Filibustering Expedition for Cuba.

HAVANA, Jan. 7, 1859.

On the 17th ult. the schooner *Violin* cleared from Nassau for Puerto Plata with a cargo of arms and ammunition. The following day (December 18) the schooner *Tweed* sailed for Jacksonville, Fla., having on board sixty Cubans as passengers. The two vessels met at sea and the Cubans were transferred to the *Violin*. Soon after the British war vessel *Lapwing*, which had been watching them, came up, and taking them in tow carried them back to Nassau.
