**Mr. Seward at Matanzas—Capture of a Schooner with a Cargo of Arms—Arrival of Santa Anna at Havana—He Is Ordered to Leave.**

HAVANA, Feb. 14, 1870.

Mr. William H. Seward has arrived at Matanzas. Several accomplices in the murder of Isaac Greenwath have been arrested.

A schooner, with a cargo of arms for the insurgents, went ashore near Gibara during a gale from the north. She was discovered by the Spanish officers and seized. Her crew escaped into the interior. At last accounts the troops were taking out the schooner's cargo.

General Santa Anna arrived in Havana yesterday. He came here from Puerto Plata with the intention of taking passage in the British steamer on the 22d inst. for Vera Cruz. But the Captain General has ordered him to leave the island by the first steamer that sails from Havana for any other than a Mexican port, being determined to allow no violation of international law. Santa Anna had a personal interview with the Captain General, but the latter was firm in his refusal to allow him to proceed to Mexico. So the ex-President will leave immediately, either for Nassau or St. Thomas.
