

THE CUBAN-AMERICAN LEAGUE.

The third meeting of the Cuban League of the United States was held last night at Delmonico's, General McMahon presiding. Among those present were Generals Granger, Granam, Hayes, Blair, Davies, Avery, Van Alen and Darling; Colonels Lamson and Raymond, Hon. Cassius M. Clay and other distinguished gentlemen. The business transacted related principally to the perfection of the organization and the distribution of circulars for the purpose of convening mass meetings to be held simultaneously in the principal cities of the Union. Arrangements were also made for distribution throughout the country of petitions to be signed by citizens asking Congress to recognize the belligerent rights of Cuba. A letter was received from Señor Miguel de Aldama, President of the Cuban Junta, thanking the league for its efforts and enclosing a check for \$500. The Finance Committee reported that subscriptions to the amount of \$600 had been paid in, and after the transaction of certain private business the meeting adjourned until next Tuesday night.
