Serious Trouble Among the Volunteers— Spanish Vendetta to Avenge Castanon— Wholesale Slaughter.

The following news has been received by private sources from Havana, under date of the 12th inst:—
The volunteers of the Second battalion, stationed at Penar del Rio, have mutinied and attempted to kill their colonel, Don Miguel Antonio Herrera, and the Lieutenant Governor of that town, who have both telegraphed to the Captain General, requesting to be recalled. It is reported that a club has been formed by Spaniards, chiefly composed of employes of the Havana Custom House, who have sworn to kill all the Cubans that come in their way in order to revenge the death of Castanon. The late assassinations are traced to them, including the attack made on the four young men which resulted in the death of Greenwath. Since the arrival of Castanon's body fifty-two persons have fallen victims to this band, twenty of whom have died, and thirty-two wounded. The Venezuelans resident in Havana have been warned that they will all be assassinated, and are leaving in great hurry.

The Consul of the North German Confederation has presented his thanks to the Casino Español for the kind action taken in the subscription for the family of Greenwath.

The volunteers are causing much trouble, and the Captain General has issued a general order requesting them to preserve order and morality, to which they reply that they have to obey no one.
