Arrival of General Quesada at St. Augustine—He is Entrusted with an Important Mission.

ST. AUGUSTINE, Feb. 25, 1870.

General Quesada, Commander-in-Chief of the Cuban army, and staff, arrived here yesterday from Cuba, via Nassau, on an important mission from President Cespedes, leaving General Jordan in command.

He left Cuba on the 27th ult., receiving the most enthusiastic demonstrations of confidence from his countrymen.

Pucilo and Goyeneche had been defeated in Camagucy.
