More Murders in Havana—Relief for the Castanon Family—Indignant Feelings of the Spaniards—The Volunteers Warned by the Captain General.

HAVANA, Feb. 3, 1870.

Two men were killed in this city last night.

Subscriptions are coming in freely for the orphans of Castañon.

The Spaniards manifest great indignation at the killing of Castañon. From all parts of the island come reports of public demonstrations of bitterness against the Cubans.

The Captain General sent a despatch to Matanzas, in which he warns the volunteers that they will give a poor idea of the government which employs them by committing acts of retaliation, and advises them to confine themselves to their duty, the maintenance of public order, in the performance of which they are the firmest staff of the authorities.
