Depositions of the Wounded Americans—No Arrests Yet Made—Accident on the Havana Railroad.

HAVANA, Feb. 8, 1870.

The declarations of Harry K. Foster, Hugh Johnson and Gardner Wells, the Americans who were attacked in the street by an unknown man, were taken before the American Consul General. They all agree in qualifying the assassination of Isaac Greenwold as most inhuman and without cause. Greenwold was buried yesterday, but to-day the body was exhumed for the purpose of embalming it. The corpse will be forwarded to New York. After the assassin had shot Greenwold a mob assembled and commenced to beat Greenwold and the two wounded men, shouting "Kill the insurgents." Harry Foster is not expected to recover. Johnson appeared to be better to-day. No one has yet been arrested for the outrage.

An old man, named Phillips, a carpenter on the Havana Railroad, was killed Sunday night.
