Burning of an American Lady's Estate by the Insurgents.

HAVANA, March 17, 1870.

The plantation of Mrs. Emerson, an American lady residing in Wilmington, N. C., situated near Sagua la Grande, has been burned by the insurgents. Six plantations near Sancti Spiritus have been also burned.

The sugar market is buoyant, owing to the reports that many plantations have nearly finished grinding. Sales were made to-day on the basis of 8½ and 8¼ reals per arroba for No. 12 Dutch standard.
