The Cuba Sale and Cession Question.

MADRID, March 17, 1870.

The controversy among the newspapers relative to the cession of the island of Cuba to the United States still continues. Some argue that now the insurrection there is nearly quelled and the dignity of Spain properly asserted it would be better to cede Cuba, and thus avoid internal troubles hereafter.

Their opponents advise these not to crave for gold, but for Spanish interests, and others still are opposed to all agitation of the question at present.
